Naturally, the expectations increase s children move up the school and there's lots to think about to meet expected writing standards. We ask that P4 and P5 parents / family members use the learning and information shared at yesterday's session to challenge children to include more ambition in their writing, and top support children to include the 'nonnegotiables' in their writing, when doing homework. - We hope all who decide to go trick or treating this evening have a fabulous time, back in costume! Stay safe, and have fun, everyone! ©

































DATES
