This involves HT and class teachers meeting 1:1 (2 hours each, after school meetings) to dissect results, progress and next steps. Continue to believe that our targets are achievable from observations in classes and jotters so far. Strong focus on practitioner enquiry and using assessment results to target areas of most need well established and should continue to support the targets as we keep pushing for our attainment goals this year.  Moderation across the learning community is underway and off to a pleasing start. We met last week and will meet again in January and then again in April.  All teaching staff have engaged with after school training around inquiry based approaches to learning. This has been minimally impactful, but we are confident that we as a school can take the learning provided further on our own, to maximise this approach and have made our own adaptations to maximise this. Play Station used increasingly, and the space is being well used for collaborative and 'find out / work it out' style learning.  Work is underway to achieve the next Digital Schools Award, this time with a particular focus on coding.  Progress is on track.

Plans are in place for additional training for school support assistants,
